a. **Welcome/Introductions** - Everyone went around the table and introduced themselves and Lindsay took the lead in starting the meeting.

b. MVTPC Update

- 1) Review of TP scholarships: Just a reminder that Sinclair Tech Prep scholarship recipients may use their scholarship dollars to pursue any degree or certificate program at Sinclair. Students may take classes at any Sinclair location or online and use their scholarship award money. Discussed student qualifications complete at least 2 TP courses in one pathway or 3 in multiple, it's ok if only TP for one year if they meet the previous criteria.
 - i. Students **cannot** use their TP scholarship the **summer immediately following** their high school graduation (i.e., a May 2018 grad cannot use their scholarship for Summer 2018)
 - ii. Students **CAN** use their TP scholarship **any subsequent summer**, as long as they were an SCC student for at least a spring or fall semester prior (i.e., a May 2018 grad becomes an SCC student Fall 2018, uses their TP scholarship and can also apply it to courses the following summer).
 - iii. For the summer after their first 'traditional' (fall or spring) semester at SCC, a student can use both the BOGO award AND the TP Scholarship.
 - iv. The TP Scholarship can be applied to required books, supplies and fees, in addition to tuition.
- 2) BOGO This year the BOGO offer is for both 2018 Tech Prep grads and 2017 Tech Prep grads. Details about the BOGO offer may be found here: http://www.mvtechprep.org/index.cfm/gallery/bogo-2018
- 3) Onsite advising: Held at MVCTC and KFHS this semester. Mapped more than 400 students, advisors come back to officially register them.
- 4) Showcase Feedback has been positive. Overwhelming number of people concerned with length of awards ceremony as well as number of categories/teams. Judges feedback sheets will be delivered both electronically and physically (if requested) within the next week.

c. Communication/Journalism Updates

- 1) Heidi shared that conversations are happening between our Office of Transfer and Articulation and the University of Dayton Communication (Media Production) Department to develop a partnership allowing our students to utilize their equipment and take their classes regarding broadcasting journalism and production. This is still in the development phase, and as additional information is available, it will be disseminated.
- 2) Dr. McGrew is stepping down from her role as Chair this summer.
- 3) Avainte is beginning her Ph.D. at UK this fall, but will still be on the staff at SCC.

d. CTE-26 Updates, Jess Moore

1) Last year (2017) schools with Arts & Communication - Media Arts programs renewed CTE-26 applications with the ODE. This process is on a 5-year cycle so the next renewal period is scheduled for 2021. Please see link. CTE-26s are "planning documents" filed by schools for CTE program funding, and it is worth noting that the 4 ODE courses listed for a pathway are not definitive; that is, a pathway teacher has flexibility in the selection and implementation of those courses. What is most important is that the end of course exams align with courses taught. A total of 4 courses minimum must be included in each

pathway program taught at the high school. The ODE will post new Arts & Communication standards in 2020. The current standards (2014) can be found here.

e. Credit capture:

- 1) Tim Bryant explained that some pathways and subjects utilize e-learn for their proficiency credit courses—The only current e-Learn offering in Media Arts is the JOUR 2101 course which requires a significant partnership with SCC faculty for grading purposes. Centerville is currently the only school with this offering. Those interested should talk with the Tech Prep office well ahead of time due to the amount of logistics necessary to execute.
- 2) Students must check, sign and date form if they want their credit posted.
- 3) Josiah Wahlrab:
 - i. <u>Multiple Measures (MM3</u>)— Tech Prep students that graduate high school with a 3.0 or higher (junior year + first semester of senior year) can sign up for select Sinclair classes without having to take standardized testing. Similarly, students with ≥ B in either Algebra II or Precalculus can sign up for select Sinclair classes without having to take standardized testing.  - ii. 2017-2018 Tech Prep Credit Capture— *likely not applicable for Vis Design & Interactive Media students...
 - 1. eLearn credit (proficiency credit) can be captured by student via online process. For additional information please visit the MVTPC website (link).
 - 2. Articulated credit can be captured via paper from— please see your coordinator if you have not received a form yet
 - iii. Tech Prep program instructors are encouraged to access the Tech Prep portal (<u>link</u>) to see dynamic lists of their Tech Prep students, and any feedback/suggestions for improvement would be especially appreciated. Please email Josiah.wahlrab@sinclair.edu.
- 4) **Career Days**: Lindsay explained that each school is able to personalize their experience when they bring students to campus. It was suggested that options outside of specific departments be explored— 'Science with Mike' by Rob McNally, Alex in Marketing, Distance Learning—how do these departments use Media Arts skills and concepts?

f. College Transition

- 1) University Transfer opportunities: Students who matriculate to Sinclair have many opportunities to continue on to complete bachelor's degrees at four-year colleges and universities that have articulation/transfer agreements with Sinclair. - 2) Sinclair application: Any students who completed the Sinclair Tech Prep application fall 2017 and plan to attend Sinclair summer of 2018 or fall of 2018 may need to reapply to Sinclair by following this link: https://apply.sinclair.edu/standard.cfm. Teachers should reach out to Josiah Wahlrab for information related to determining if their students need to reapply. This year should be the last year that students need to take action in reactivating their Sinclair accounts.
 - **i. Tech Prep Checklist:** this replaced the prior years' tri-folds. They were distributed to schools earlier this semester.
 - **ii. Scholarship packets:** Partner schools will receive their scholarship packets by dates requested to the MVTPC office. This typically happens in late April and continues through May. Need MM3 and CTE data to complete. Jammie Schneider will be gathering graduation information to identify when schools need packets.
