MEETING MINUTES

Lindsay Pitstick, MVTPC Pathways Manager, welcomed the group and addressed housekeeping items.

Lindsay Pitstick then updated the group regarding changes and modifications to Sinclair Community College (SCC) and MVTPC since the last meeting Spring 2017.

- New Health Sciences Building
 - Opened August 2017
 - \$31.5 million investment
 - o 141,000 square feet
 - o Dental Health Clinic, Rehabilitation Clinic and Surgical Simulation Suite among resources for students
- SCC passed 10 year operating levy in November 2017 will ensure cost of attendance stays low, and meets institutional strategic goals—Quality and Innovation, Community Alignment, Sustainability and Accessibility
- SCC is in process of purchasing new Learning Center location in Centerville, currently Far Hills Church on Clyo Road. Classes could start as soon as August 2018 at this location.
- SCC Building 10 Renovation
 - Purpose: Get students off to good start with integrated, easily accessible student services
 - Shared renderings of new space
 - o \$13 million investment
 - Likely to finish Spring 2019
- Three SCC 4-year degrees are currently under state consideration for approval:
 - Unmanned Aerial Systems
 - Industrial Automation
 - Advanced Manufacturing
- The Higher Learning Commission visited campus in early February regarding continued accreditation and academic integrity at Sinclair.
- Divisional reorganization has occurred, and now Tech Prep, College Credit Plus and Project Lead the Way are in the same division, and overseen by former College Credit Plus Director, Melissa Tolle, who is now the Chief School Partnerships Officer at SCC.

Ohio 8 Initiatives

- The Ohio 8 is a strategic alliance composed of the superintendents and teacher union presidents from Ohio's eight urban school districts – Akron, Canton, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, Toledo and Youngstown.
- The Ohio 8 Coalition was founded on the principle that a high-performance public education system is essential to the civic and economic health of Ohio's cities. The Coalition is the first-ever formal collaboration of Ohio's urban superintendents and teacher union presidents. With a strong emphasis on collaboration and partnership, the Coalition enables superintendents and union presidents to work together on issues of common concern and brings a shared labor-management perspective in addressing challenges of urban education.
- In line with their guiding principles, TP is partnering with DPS to assisting in developing a structured sophomore recruitment plan to make their TP programs more competitive and selective:
 - 1/17 DPS observe CHS 16 DPS and 2 ODE
 - 2/21 DPS observe KFHS 7 DPS teachers and admin
 - Next step: late March—meeting with DPS schools to create their recruitment plan for implementation
- 1/31/18 Dayton Development Coalition/Tech Prep/IT Meeting
 - o 20+ attendees: West Region TP secondary reps, SCC representation, Jobs Ohio and Technology First
 - Address pipeline and talent gap regarding IT in Ohio
 - Planned in conjunction with Miami Valley Hackathon hosted here at Sinclair: Teens in the Miami Valley
 are creating apps and tech that you may one day use to keep your home safe and secure.
 - 22 teams from 16 high schools in the Miami Valley had 12 weeks to complete projects in four categories- apps, robotics, drones and cybersecurity

- HOSA (Health Occupation Students of America)
 - 2/20 TP and Sinclair hosted the HOSA Regional Competition. Approx 333 students from 10 schools competed across 5 categories, and those who placed will proceed to compete at the state competition.
 - This was our first year hosting, and Megan did such a great job, the leaders of the organization intend to hold the event here at SCC next year as well.
- Getting Ready for College 2/15/18
 - Annual event went well, 600+ attendees, positive feedback. Will move event about 30 minutes earlier next year to accommodate.
- 1/24 kicked off the beginning of our Pre-Apprenticeship and WBL series due to high industry demand and state initiatives. Kristina R. will share more on this event and our forward movement.

Lucious Plant, Director of Talent Acquisition for the Dayton Development Coalition (DDC), spoke about **Industry Investment and Jobs Ohio:**

- Jobs Ohio
 - o Bring new companies/jobs to Ohio
 - West Region (DDC) supports Columbus initiatives and carries out their mission from a regional perspective
- Occupational Sectors of Focus dictate strategy
 - Ohio has 5 big game changers:
 - Shale Energy
 - Big Data Analytics
 - Advanced Manufacturing
 - Infrastructure
 - Talent
- 80% of economic development in our region comes from existing companies
 - They are growing
 - Talent is biggest need for them
- Expansion program in the region partner with Business First
- Strong partnerships with education partners are necessary to bring high profile attraction projects to Ohio (Amazon HQ, Foxconn, Toyota/Mazda)
- State has decided to offer talent acquisition services: attraction, sourcing, pre-screening and training

Kristina Ropos, Career Tech Professional Development Consultant for our region, spoke about the Pre-Apprenticeship and Work-Based Learning (WBL) Workshop Series:

- Provided recap of 1/24/18 event on Sinclair's campus
 - o 180 participants
 - Why: The Office of Career-Technical Education, The Miami Valley Tech Prep Consortium and SST CTPD
 Consultant are hosting this regional meeting to provide information and assistance regarding preapprenticeship program recognition to the Ohio State Apprenticeship Council (OSAC), ApprenticeOhio.
- Think Tank (committee) group formed from this event. Think Tank met in February to begin planning March 21 workshop
- Mentioned the resource of the State Support team

Joe Turner, Senior Account Executive at Adecco, spoke regarding the advantages of working with Adecco (and the state's agreement/partnership) for WBL and Internships:

- Pre-Apprenticeship needs and opportunities have increased
- Skills Gap remains
- Desperate need for WBL

Kim Gambill, Warren County Career Center, spoke about working together to provide Driver's Training in the Consortium:

- Students cannot afford Driver's Ed Training (avg. cost in Warren Co. \$469) which means they can't go to work because they don't have a way to get there—large barrier for WBL/Pre-Apprenticeship
- Kim is willing to spearhead a regional approach to provide driver's education and overcome this hurdle
 - Needs attendees to complete her evaluation she has emailed; let her know what the driver's education options are in your county
- Isn't asking for money—just resources and support

Tim Bryant, Data Technician, spoke about Credit Capture:

- How to complete credit capture forms Due June 1, 2018
 - o Articulated, proficiency and Project Lead the Way (PLTW) credit
 - Supportive Documentation necessary for some pathways
 - Student signature required for articulated credit
 - Schedule pick up/drop off or upload documents to TP portal, then provide originals later

Liz Jensen, Kettering Fairmont High School Career Tech Principal, spoke about the success of their math curriculum delivery and changes:

- ODHE requires specific math courses for most majors
- 3 new Math TP course options that align with associates degree programs because MAT 1270 and 1370 phased out
 - MAT 1110: Math for Technologists
 - o MAT 1120: Business Math
 - o MAT 1130: Allied Health Math

- Will count for 4th HS math credit, and also align with many Associates Degree progams at SCC
 - 190 seniors are CT at KFHS; 116 are doing onsite registration to attend SCC, so large population attends
 SCC
- Shared KFHS story—buy-in, implementation, sentiments from teachers and students, etc.
- Also offers these courses to non-TP students for HS credit but not college credit
