Tech Prep Policies & Procedures

Effective for Class of 2020

Tech Prep students interested in pursuing a Health Sciences Associate Degree/Certificate program at Sinclair Community College must complete the ***Tech Prep Health Sciences Preferred Program of Application*** by the return date noted on the form.

Students may only select one program of interest and must meet all program prerequisites, admission requirements, and TEAS expectations by the end of Sinclair's spring semester of the year following high school graduation. Any transfer credits must be on the Sinclair transcript by the end of spring semester, as well.

Students who complete all prerequisites and requirements by the deadline will receive consideration for the Tech Prep Admission Pathway.

Procedure:

Starting with the graduating class of 2020, Health Sciences associate degree programs, will reserve up to 10% of their open enrollment seats annually for qualified Tech Prep students.

- If there are more qualified Tech Prep students than there are seats, the Tech Prep Pathway Rubric will be used to rank students, with the highest ranking students being selected first.
- Additional Tech Prep seats may be available, but that will vary by program, based on enrollment demand (see Academic Advising).
- Any qualified Tech Prep student who does not receive preferred selection will still be eligible for the program's open enrollment or competitive selection tracks.

Students who decline preferred selection into the Tech Prep Pathway are eligible for future open enrollment and competitive selection tracks, assuming they meet all eligibility requirements.

Tech Prep Pathway Rubric

Criteria	Points Earned
Sinclair Grade Point Average: <ul style="list-style-type: none">The student's actual college GPA at the end of spring semester following high school graduation will be used. The points awarded will equal the GPA (rounded to the tenth place) x 10.	
*TEAS Results: <ul style="list-style-type: none">Meets minimum scores on first attempt = 20Meets minimum scores with two attempts = 10Meets minimum scores with three or more attempts = 0 <p><i>*Note: HS programs evaluate TEAS differently, by overall scores, category scores, and/or a combination of; they also have different minimum scores. Points will be awarded based on number of attempts to achieve the program's minimum scores.</i></p>	
Points will be given for each Sinclair Science course completed that applies to the students program curriculum. Points will be given based on grade earned on <u>First Attempt</u>: <ul style="list-style-type: none">Receives A grade = 20Receives B grade = 10Receives C grade = 5Receives A,B,C grade after multiple attempts = 0

In the event of a tie between student scores, the eligibility date will be used to determine ranking.
