COURSE DESCRIPTION

Orientation to the healthcare delivery system including history, economics, medical/legal issues, professionalism, ethics, sociological aspects and wellness concepts. Orientation to the use of technology in the healthcare system will also be provided including user interfaces, telecommunications and networks. The development of healthcare team skills including critical thinking and problem solving strategies and multicultural healthcare perspectives will be presented. 2 credit hours. One lecture hours, three lab hours per week.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The learning objectives of this course are to enable the student to:

- 1. <u>Allied Health Professions and Professionalism</u>: Demonstrate an appreciation for, and knowledge of, interrelationships among allied health professionals.
 - 1.a. Discuss the history of healthcare to include the development of the professions.
 - 1.b. Discuss the impact of social influences on the development of healthcare.
 - 1.c. Discuss the impact of history on the development of healthcare facilities.

- 1.d. Recognize various healthcare professions and their connectivity.
- 1.e. Express an appreciation for and knowledge of the interrelationship among allied health professions.
- 1.f. Identify appropriate professional behaviors and attitudes.
- 2. <u>Interpersonal Communications</u>: Exploration of the development, maintenance, and termination of interpersonal relationships as found in healthcare.
 - 2.a. Define and explain basic terms, principles, and theories of interpersonal communication.
 - 2.b. Demonstrate understanding of the following aspects of interpersonal relationships: verbal, nonverbal, listening, perception, conflict, power, influence, gender, and diversity.
- 3. <u>Critical Thinking in Healthcare</u>: Demonstrate effective critical thinking and problem-solving strategies for quality healthcare delivery.
 - 3.a. Identify models of problem solving.
 - 3.b. Utilize methods of evaluating appropriateness, truthfulness, usefulness and validity of online resources.
 - 3.c. Apply appropriate problem-solving methods to a given simulation with attention to consequences.
- <u>Components of Healthful Living</u>: Identify the components of healthful living that reflect an appreciation for the community at large and self with regards to the promotion of healthy lifestyles.
 - 4.a. Identify aspects of a healthful lifestyle.
 - 4.b. Assess the impact of personal behavior, environment and culture on healthful living.
- 5. <u>Dynamics of Society and Healthcare</u>: A critical analysis of the dynamics between society and their relationship to healthcare.
 - 5.a. Examine the nature of cultural groups within the healthcare delivery system.
 - 5.b. Examine the impact of public policy on the United States healthcare system.
 - 5.c. Examine healthcare inequities with the United States healthcare system with regards to class, race, gender and age.
- 6. <u>Principles of Medicolegal Issues</u>: Identify basic principles of medicolegal issues in healthcare delivery including proprietary software, data security, information privacy and confidentiality.
 - 6.a. Recognize medicolegal terminology.
 - 6.b. Identify legal and ethical issues in the healthcare delivery system.
 - 6.c. Discuss HIPAA and its impact on patient rights, electronic data and confidentiality.
 - 6.d. Recognize patient rights.
 - 6.e. Examine code of ethics of a given profession.
 - 6.f. Apply code of ethics of a given profession to assigned simulation.
- 7. <u>Knowledge of Healthcare Economics</u>: Demonstrate knowledge of how economics impact healthcare.
 - 7.a. Identify different types of healthcare insurance.
 - 7.b. Identify and discuss the challenges of the delivery of healthcare across the nation.
 - 7.c. Debate pros and cons of the healthcare delivery system.
- 8. <u>Technology of Healthcare</u>: Describe technology-based allied health applications in hospitals, community health agencies, education and research.
 - 8.a. Demonstrate basic skills in computer productivity software, word-processing, spreadsheet, presentation and desktop publishing.
 - 8.b. Demonstrate basic and advance skills in Internet searching.
 - 8.c. Demonstrate use of course management software.
 - 8.d. Examine current applications of technology in healthcare.

8.e. Report the impact of technology in the future of healthcare.

FACULTY RESPONSIBILITES

- Faculty will be prepared prior to class meeting times.
- Faculty will present students with an explanation and/or demonstration of each learning exercise during class time.
